# YOUR VOTING RIGHTS AT A GLANCE

## You have the right to:

-  Vote privately and independently.
-  Vote even if you have a guardian. You don't need their permission.
-  Ask for help if you need it.
-  Bring someone with you to help you vote, or ask a poll worker to help you.
-  Have an accessible polling site.
-  Use whatever assistive technology you need to vote.
-  You do not have to pass any sort of test or prove to poll workers that you can vote.
-  To vote in person, you only need to be able to communicate who you are and where you live.
-  You do not need a photo ID to vote.
-  No one can tell you who to vote for.

## If you vote in person, don't forget to:

-  Wear your mask
-  Practice social distancing
-  Bring hand sanitizer
-  Wash your hands, cover coughs & sneezes
